Feast of the Assumption of the BVM



St Bartholomew - Apostle

On Monday we celebrate the feast of St Bartholomew one of the apostles who was born in Cana. He was led to Jesus by the apostle Philip and after the Lord's Ascension tradition has it that he preached the Gospel in India and there suffered martyrdom. He is only mentioned a few times in the Synoptic Gospels – in Mark 3:18 he is one of the twelve whom Jesus calls to be with Him and names as apostles: *"and Andrew, Philip and Bartholomew...."*

Reflection on Twenty-first Sunday

At last Peter recognises that Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ. At last he realises that in Jesus they can see the action of God. The disciples followed Jesus as soon as He called, but for a long time they were puzzled what to make of Him, of His wonderful teaching and his godlike personality. Now comes a shaft of light and understanding. We too often take some time to appreciate the true worth of someone we know well: a little gesture can sometimes reveal just how generous and thoughtful they are. Peter suddenly grasps that there is God, acting among them, a daunting or even terrifying thought. Jesus replies to Peter's recognition with His own generosity, giving him a new name "Rock", for this is what 'Peter' means. If you name something, you make it your own, take it to yourself. This is just what Jesus does with Simon who becomes His own Peter. That is the importance of the names of a child at Baptism – the first thing that the Priest/Deacon says to the parents at Baptism is "What name have you given this Child?" Jesus takes us to Himself and we come His. The early Christians called themselves, 'Those over whom the name of Jesus has been called'. We may have been named Mary or John, but the name of Jesus has been called over us and, through our baptism, we have become His.

Yesterday afternoon at Our Lady's, we welcomed baby Savannah Hill into the Church through the sacrament of Baptism and through the words "... the Christian community welcomes you with great joy. In its name I claim you for Christ our Saviour..." Savannah is now a child of God. Please keep Savannah, her parents Martyn and Laura and all her family in your prayers throughout the week ahead for, like each one of us, Savannah has been claimed by Christ

May Our Lady, Help of Christians, St Joseph, St Lawrence and St Rita pray for us all.
