All Saints Day 1st November – Holy Day of Obligation

This coming Tuesday, 1st November, is the Solemnity of All Saints, when the Church celebrates all those who have reached the full glory of heaven. It is a Holy Day of Obligation – which means that the Feast is so important to our Faith that we are to treat the day like a Sunday

All Souls Day – 2nd November

On Wednesday we celebrate All Souls Day. Today we pray for all who have died and who are not yet enjoying the Beatific Vision in heaven – but they are on their way in that place or process which we call Purgatory. We



pray for all our loved ones especially today and throughout the month of November. All Souls Day is not a Holy Day of Obligation. However, we will have two Masses scheduled for parishioners to attend if they so wish. There will be Mass at 10.00am and again at 7.00pm.

New Bishop for East Anglia

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, has appointed Reverend Canon Peter Collins, a priest of the Archdiocese of Cardiff, as the Fifth Bishop of East Anglia. On 13th March 1976, by decree Quod Ecumicum, Pope Paul VI formed the Diocese of East Anglia out of the Diocese of Northampton and as such we still have a long and treasured associated with our brothers & sisters in East Anglia. Please hold Bishop Elect Peter Collins in your prayers as well as Bishop Alan, the Priests, Deacons, Religious and the laity of East Anglia. All Saints - Who are we? St. John answers that beautifully in our second reading today: "We are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed, we shall be like him..."

The Solemnity of All Saints today reminds us of who we are and what a bright future can be ours. As we celebrate today all the saints, both those canonized and those who are unknown to us, we are joyful that they have reached the goal of life, heaven. They remind us to keep our sights fixed high, to remember who we are and the glorious possibility that God offers each and every one of us.

The saints encourage us in our own struggles because, like us, they also endured immense hardships but they grew from strength to strength, they matured in the Lord as they grew in years. We also see this journey of growth in the great people of the Bible. We could think of Abraham whom Genesis tells us pretended his wife was his sister because he was afraid but Abraham grew to become our father in faith. Moses had a speech impediment and had murdered and protested against being called by God but he led his people to the Promised Land. In the Gospels Peter is impulsive and doesn't want the Lord to suffer but in Acts he is totally transformed and considers it an honour to suffer for the Lord. Interestingly in Acts even Peter's shadow is a source of healing, something which is not said of Jesus in the Gospels. Obviously, Peter's Formation Adviser was out of this world!

All Souls - After judgment three choices await us: hell, purgatory or heaven; hell, for those who have rejected God, heaven for those who die as saints and purgatory for everybody else. We would all like to go immediately to heaven when we die but we need to ask ourselves, are we living in such a way that we will die as saints? Would it be more realistic for us to expect to spend some time in purgatory being purified? Only perfect love can see God face to face, so in purgatory we are purified that we may see God face to face. On the solemnity of the Holy Souls, we especially pray for all the souls who are still in purgatory undergoing purification and growing in love before they are ready to see God face to face in heaven. It is out of our belief in purgatory that the commemoration of the Holy Souls springs for if we didn't believe in purgatory today's commemoration of the Holy Souls and our prayers for them would not make sense.

We believe that God is all merciful and that Jesus' passion, death and resurrection saved us but that does not excuse us from being purified. Jesus has saved us but we still need to make amends for the sins that we have committed and we need to be purified. This expiation for sin must be made either in this life or the next. During life we receive many opportunities to expiate sin through the sacraments and through our sufferings but after death any unexpiated sin needs to be purified. This is what Purgatory is, purification for unexpiated sin, being healed of the negative effects of sin which do not leave us totally open to grace.

May Our Lady, Help of Christians, Our Lady of the Rosary, St Lawrence, St Joseph, St John Henry Newman, St Rita, St Martin de Porres, St Winifred, St Charles Borromeo, and all the Saints in Heaven pray for us all.
