ST STEPHEN was one of the first deacons of the Christian Church and was the first Christian martyr. Stephen is believed to have been a Greek Jew who converted to Christianity. When the number of disciples increased, there was much confusion over the distribution of alms and the serving of the poor. Stephen's trustworthy character marked him out, and he was chosen as one of the seven deacons who would perform this task. St Stephen is the patron of Altar Servers and today we give thanks to God for the Altar Servers in our Parish and in our Diocese. The guild

medal that is worn by Altar Servers is pictured here – in the centre are the letters XP the first two letters of the name of Christ in Greek; at the top is the crown of victory given by God to everyone who overcomes evil, especially those who die for him; at the bottom are the palm branches, traditional symbols of martyrs who died for Christ; around the edge are the Latin words of the Guild motto:

CUI SERVIRE REGNARE EST - 'TO SERVE CHRIST IS TO REIGN'



THE HOLY INNOCENTS - During the octave of Christmas, the Church celebrates the memory of the small children of the neighbourhood of Bethlehem put to death by Herod. Sacrificed by a wicked monarch, these innocent lives bear witness to Christ who was persecuted from the time of His birth by a world which would not receive Him. It is Christ Himself who is at stake in this mass-murder of the children; already the choice, for or against Him, is put clearly before mankind. But the persecutors are powerless, for Christ came to perform a work of salvation that nothing can prevent; when He fell into the hands of His enemies at the time chosen by God it was to redeem the world by His own Blood.



ST THOMAS BECKETT was born in London in 1118. He was a cleric of the Church of Canterbury and became Chancellor of the kingdom and then in 1162 was chosen to be Archbishop. He strenuously defended the rights of the Church against King Henry II and he was exiled to France for six years. On his return to his country, he again had to bear many trials and finally, in 1170, following the infamous trial in Northampton, he was murdered by the king's followers in Canterbury Cathedral itself. **St Thomas Beckett is the Secondary Patron of the Diocese and so we especially pray today for Bishop David, Bishop Emeritus Peter, the Priests, Deacons, Religious and people of our Diocese & Parish**
