season of Lent and the call to fast and pray during the holy season. Any donations from the lunch will go towards CAFOD's Syria Turkey Emergency Appeal.





Shrove Tuesday Shriving Service at Ss Peter and Paul Anglican Church Olney. Tuesday 21st Feb at 12ish (after the 11.55 race). Our guest speaker is Simon Poole:

Simon lives in Bicester, he is a duathlete representing Great Britain at multiple world and European championships. Simon is part of the Elite Sport Team for Christians in Sport; he supports elite and professional track and field athletes across the world through the highs and lows of elite sport through big competitions like the world championships and the Olympic games. Simon is one of the leaders at Town Church, Bicester. He is speaking on Romans 5 v 8 'But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.'



**Ss Cyril and Methodius** - Cyril was born in Salonika and was educated at Constantinople. With his brother Methodius he went to Moravia to preach the faith. They both translated the liturgical books into the Slavonic language using the Cyrillic alphabet which they invented. They were called to Rome and here Cyril died on 14<sup>th</sup> February in the year 869. Methodius was made a bishop and went to Pannonia (Hungary) where he laboured ceaselessly in preaching the gospel, while enduring many hardships as a result of jealously, though he had the support of the Holy See. He died on 6<sup>th</sup> April in the year 885 at Velehrad in Czechoslovakia.



## The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order

These seven men were born in Florence and led lives as hermits on Monte Senario, especially venerating the Blessed Virgin Mary. They then preached through the length and breadth of Tuscany, and founded the Order of Servites which in 1304 received the approval of the Holy See. They are venerated on this day which is said to be the day which St Alexis Falconieri, one of the seven, died in the year 1310

## Reflection on Sunday's Gospel Reading - Matthew 5:17-37



Today Jesus instructs His disciples what not to do. He begins His instructions by saying:

"Do not think that I have come abolish the law and the prophets, I have come, not to abolish them, but to fulfil them."

He continues on: "Of this much I assure you: until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter of the law... shall be done away with until it all comes true. Anyone who fulfils the law is the least in the kingdom."

Then He adds: "Whoever fulfils and teaches these commandments shall be great in the kingdom of God. And unless your holiness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of God."

Jesus also speaks about judging others. If we judge a sister or brother, we are the ones who will be liable for judgment, not them. He then talks about anger. He tells his disciples that if they get angry or use abusive language they will be held in contempt and they also are risking "the fires of Gehenna." Jesus warns his disciples about the danger of thoughts of impurity, adultery, divorce or making false oaths or pledges.

He ends with these words: "Say 'Yes' when you mean "yes" and 'no' when you mean "no." Anything else is from the evil one."

Take a moment and ask yourself: how often do I speak and words that are neither just nor appropriate? Maybe far too often! Yet, we continue to do it. Why do we do this? Most of us know what is appropriate and inappropriate yet we continue to berate, judge, or demean others.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is very clear about what we are not to do! Today pause a moment and ask yourself:

- Do I take Jesus' words seriously?
- Do I strive to live as He calls us to live?
- Or will I continue to act in a manner I know is not healthy for me or for the people in my life?

Every day, every moment, we have a choice! What will we choose today?
