THIS IS HOLY WEEK

The most holy and deeply moving week of the Christian Year

As we journey towards Good Friday, we remember the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus and pray:

- Who else but God could take a cross that represented defeat and turn it into a symbol of Victory?
- Who else but God could take a cross that represented **guilt** and turn into a symbol for **Grace?**
- Who else but God could take a cross that represented **condemnation** and turn it into a symbol of **Freedom?**
- Who else but God could take a cross that represented **pain and suffering** and turn it into a symbol of **Healing and Hope?**
- Who else but God could take a cross that represented death and turn it into a symbol of Life?

Sr Hannah Sullivan DHS – RIP – the Requiem Mass for Sr Hannah will be celebrated here at Our Lady's on **Wednesday 5**th **April at 11am.**



SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - In preparation for celebrating the great feast of Easter, there will be a special Service of Reconciliation here at Our Lady's this **Wednesday 5th April at 7.00pm**. Fr David will be assisted by three other priests.

There will be other opportunities to celebrate Confession: **Monday 9.15-9,50am**, after Stations of the Cross at **7.00pm on Good Friday**, and on **Holy Saturday** after Matins, Lauds and Divine Mercy Novena **at 10.30am**.









The Easter Triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and concludes with Vespers (Evening Prayer) on Easter Sunday. From Good Friday until Divine Mercy Sunday we will be praying the Divine Mercy Novena. A brief guide to the events that form the Easter Triduum, which includes references to passages from Scripture, together with information on the Divine Mercy Novena is available on the parish website under the 'Prayers & Reflections' tab.



The Chrism Mass is being held at 11.00am on Thursday 6th April at the Cathedral with Bishop David as the Principal Celebrant. During this Mass Bishop David will bless the oil of the Sick and the Oil of Catechumens and, together with the Priests of the Diocese, will consecrate the Oil of Chrism. These Holy Oils will be used by the Priests and Deacons of our Diocese throughout the coming year. Also, at this very special Mass, the Priests of our Diocese will renew their Priestly Promises. We thank God for our Bishop, David, and for the Priests of our Diocese, especially of course our Parish Priest, Father David as well as our retired Priests, Fr Malcolm & Fr Patrick – we pray especially for them on this day.

RECEIVING THE PRECIOUS BLOOD FROM THE

CHALICE - Bishop David has granted permission for parish priests to reintroduce the giving of the Precious Blood at all Masses from Maundy Thursday. He says that each parish should make their own decision as to when and how to do this. The Bishop strongly encourages us to use the opportunity to provide some developed catechesis on the Eucharist as well as on the actual

reception of the Chalice. Would parishioners like this to happen? Please let me know. If we are to reintroduce reception of the Precious Blood from the Chalice, we will need to have volunteers to become Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. These will need to be trained. If we go ahead with this we will begin on the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi** (The Body and Blood of Christ) on 11th June. Do let me know what you think.


DIVINE MERCY NOVENA This lovely devotion was revealed to St Faustina in Poland and has spread throughout the world. It recalls God's infinite mercy and how we can pray for the gift of that mercy upon the world, the Church and ourselves. The Novena for Divine Mercy begins on Good Friday (at 7.00pm this year with Stations of the Cross in our church) and over 9 days it prepares us for Divine Mercy Sunday on the Second Sunday of Easter. PALM SUNDAY REFLECTION – 'Today, Palm Sunday, we remember how the crowds went out to meet Christ calling out: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." Then we listen to that part of the Gospel which describes the passion and death of Our Lord. This Holy Week then, we are to set out to meet Christ in His passion, in those last days of His suffering.

We go out to meet Him first, in order to follow Him. He said to us, "If you want to be my disciple, you must deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me." So, in what we read in the Gospel story and from our own experience of life and what is

going on in the world around us, the experience of the world's suffering is taken by Christ in order to sanctify it, to give it meaning and significance. During this Holy Week, hour by hour, we can follow Christ in those moments of His passion.

It is good then to decide now that this is indeed going to be a Holy Week, a different week, a week when we meet Christ in His passion in order that, when the resurrection is celebrated, we can, after Easter Sunday, follow Him more closely and witness to Him – Christ who suffered, died, and rose from the dead.'
