

Invitation from St Peter & St Paul Parish Church,

Olney - we are delighted to host a Deanery Choral Evensong and I forward some information for you; I hope we can gather and worship God together and encourage one another. Our speaker will be our very own Area Dean. Please encourage members of your choir / singing group to join us at 6pm on Sunday 10th September 2023 for an ecumenical Choral Evensong, for which rehearsals

will be from **7pm until 8:30pm on Thursday 7th September** in the Parish Church of St Peter and St Paul in Olney and from **3:30pm until 5pm on the day** (attendance at one of these strongly advised). We will be singing the Responses by William Byrd, who died on 4th July 1623. Byrd was an English Renaissance composer considered among the greatest composers of the Renaissance, he had a profound influence on composers both from his native country and on the Continent. He is often considered along with John Dunstaple and Henry Purcell as one of England's most important early music composers. He produced sacred music for Anglican Services, but during the 1570s he became a Roman Catholic, and wrote Catholic sacred music later in his life.



NEW LECTIONARY - The Dicastery for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments has confirmed the approval by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales for the new Lectionary. The Lectionary, which includes the scripture readings for Mass and the sacraments, will come into use in Catholic parishes in England and Wales from Advent 2024.

Cardinal Arthur Roche, Prefect of the Dicastery, wrote to Cardinal Vincent Nichols, President of the Bishops' Conference, confirming the new translation of the Lectionary, which has been done in collaboration with the Bishops' Conference of Scotland. He said: "The use of the English Standard Version – Catholic Edition, already in use in India, along with the Abbey Psalms and Canticles will help to ensure that the Word of the Lord reaches God's holy people without alloy. The Lectionary will be in use from Advent 2024 and will be published by the Catholic Truth Society (CTS).



St Ignatius Loyola, Priest was born in the year 1491 at Loyola in northern Spain, his early life was led at court and in the army. He was later converted to a life of holiness. He studied theology at Paris and gathered companions around him and afterwards at Rome he formed the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). He exercised a very fruitful apostolate by his written work and by the formation of his disciples who were outstanding in the reform of the Church. He died at Rome in the year 1556. St Alphonsus Liguori – Bishop & Doctor was born in Naples in the year 1696. He studied law and took his doctor's degree in both civil and canon law, became a priest and later founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists). In order to promote among the faithful a truly Christian life he spent his time in preaching and in writing, especially about moral theology of which discipline he is looked upon as the master. He was chosen to be Bishop of Sant' Agata dei Goti, but soon gave up the post and returned to his own Congregation where he died at Nocera dei Pagani in Campagna in the year 1787



St John Mary Vianney – Priest was born at Lyons in the year 1786. After overcoming tremendous difficulties, he was finally ordained priest. He was given charge of the parish of Ars in the diocese of Belley, and by his forthright preaching, personal mortification, prayer, and charity renewed it and increased it in a wonderful way. His help to those who came to the sacrament of confession was renowned and people flocked to him from all sides to obtain his advice. He died in the year 1859. In his catechetical instructions, St John Mary Vianney writes, 'We had deserved to be left incapable of praying; but God in His goodness has permitted us to speak to Him. Our prayer is an incense that is delightful to God.'

St John Mary Vianney is the Patron Saint of Parish Priests.
