For the Archdiocese of Birmingham, two new Auxiliary Bishops were announced and Bishop David sent congratulations to Mgr Timothy Menezes and Canon Richard Walker. 

St John of Avila – was born in the Castile region of Spain, John was sent at the age of 14 to the University of Salamanca to study law. He later moved to Alcala, where he studied philosophy and theology before his ordination as a diocesan priest. After John's parents died and left him as their sole heir to a considerable fortune, he distributed his money to the poor. In 1527, he travelled to Seville, hoping to become a missionary in Mexico. The archbishop of that city persuaded him to stay and spread the faith in Andalusia. During nine years of work there, he developed a reputation as an engaging preacher, a perceptive spiritual director, and a wise confessor.

Because John was not afraid to denounce vice in high places, he

was investigated by the Inquisition but was cleared in 1533. He later worked in Cordoba and then in Granada, where he organized the University of Baeza, the first of several colleges run by diocesan priests who dedicated themselves to teaching and giving spiritual direction to young people.

He was friends with Saints Francis Borgia, Ignatius of Loyola, John of God, John of the Cross, Peter of Alcantara, and Teresa of Avila. John of Avila worked closely with members of the Society of Jesus and helped their growth within Spain and its colonies. John's mystical writings have been translated into several languages. He was beatified in 1894, canonized in 1970, and declared a doctor of the Church on October 7, 2012.

Reflection on the Solemnity of The Ascension



This coming Thursday, the Church will be celebrating the Solemnity of The Ascension - the ascent of Jesus Christ into heaven on the 40th day after his resurrection. The Feast of the Ascension ranks with Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost in the universality of its observance among Christians and has been has been celebrated 40 days after Easter in both Eastern and Western Christianity since the 4th century. Prior to that time, the Ascension was commemorated as a part of the celebration of the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Just before the passion and suffering of Jesus, his friends and followers witnessed him being betrayed, denied and condemned. They stood at a distance and watched him die a very public

and humiliating death - some of them even deserted him. When they were told by some of the others that they had seen the Lord, they refused to believe them; they doubted. Eventually, after seeing the risen Lord for themselves several times, they believed that he had indeed risen from the dead. And now Jesus is preparing them for his departure and his return to heaven. The disciples thought they had lost Jesus once when he died, now they have to face the reality of life without him again – Jesus is leaving them – but he is not leaving them alone; he is not deserting or abandoning them. The reality is that he is going to be with them in a very personal and intimate way. In the Gospels, Jesus told his followers that he would give them another Advocate to be with them forever; "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you." John 14:26. Before Jesus takes his leave of them, he passes on and entrusts them with the responsibility of carrying on his mission of proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel and of establishing the Kingdom of God. This ordinary group of men and women are the ones who were chosen by Jesus to be heralds and witnesses of the resurrection. Through their words and actions, the world will know that Jesus is alive and more alive and present than ever he was. As the earthly life of Jesus ends, theirs and our mission and ministry begins. Today that responsibility now belongs to us. The first friends and followers of Jesus are our ancestors and we are their descendants. It is now up to each of us in our way to carry on the mission and ministry of Jesus. Through us today, the world will know that Jesus is alive, present and active in our world. As Pope Francis says to each of us "every Christian is a missionary to the extent that they have experienced the love of God in Jesus."

Even as we celebrate the solemnity of The Ascension, it is most important that we understand and believe that Jesus has not left, deserted or abandoned us. He is with us when we are able to gather together at the celebration of Mass; he is with us when we reach out to support one another with our love; he is with us in both the good times and bad times in our lives. As he tells us in the Gospel, "Go therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always, yes, to the end of time." Matthew 28:19-20

May Our Lady, Help of Christians, St Joseph, St Lawrence, St John Henry Newman, St Rita, St John Avila, St Fremund, pray for us all as we continue to bask in the joys of Easter.
