



October - Month of the Holy Rosary

During the month of October, traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary, Pope Leo XIV has called on Catholics around the world to pray the Rosary daily, uniting in prayer for peace in war-torn regions. Announced during the Wednesday General Audience, the Holy Father encourages the faithful to join in this powerful prayer of intercession.



St Francis of Assisi

St Francis was born at Assisi in the year 1182 - from being a light-hearted youth, he changed, gave up his inheritance and bound himself to God, embracing poverty and living the life of the gospels. He preached to all the love of God. He gave to his followers' wise rules which were approved by the Holy See. He laid the foundation of an order of nuns, of groups of penitents living in the world, and of preaching the gospel to infidels. He died in the year 1226. We celebrate his feast day this coming Saturday – 4th October.

Installation of Two New Canons at Northampton Cathedral

On Thursday 18th September 2025, Northampton Cathedral welcomed the installation of Canon Christopher Perry and Canon Simon Penhalagan, Dean of the Cathedral, into the Cathedral Chapter. The celebration took place during midday prayer, in the presence of their brother Canons gathering to witness this important moment in the life of

our Diocese. What is a Canon? - A canon is a priest who has been specially appointed to serve as a member of the Cathedral Chapter, a body that supports the bishop in the governance of the cathedral and, historically, in the wider governance of the diocese. Canons have both a symbolic and a practical role: they are called to model prayerful service, safeguard the mission of the Church, and strengthen the unity of clergy and people around the bishop. Our parish sends our love and prayers to both Canon Christopher & Canon Simon.



October - the Month of the Holy Rosary

The Rosary is a prayer favoured by so many saints in the life of the church – Padre Pio, Pope St John Paul II, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, and many, many others. It is a powerful prayer – useful in intercession for ourselves, the Church and the world, a help in temptation and trials, a comfort in tribulation and desolation.

The Rosary is a form of meditation. As we pray the ten Hail Marys in each decade, we ponder on one of the events of the

life of Jesus and of Mary - but we do not do this on our own. In a sense, we are putting our hand into that of Mary and she guides us to look at these events through her eyes, with her hearts and her mind. Mary is a great model of this kind of prayer.

We are told in Luke's Gospel on several occasions that she treasured these things in her heart – **she pondered over them.** Mary teaches us through the Rosary to look with her eyes at the life of her Son, to ponder over these events, these mysteries, to contemplate Jesus and the whole marvellous plan of God which is summed up in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. In mediating on the life of Jesus as He was on earth, we are led by Mary to contemplate Jesus as He is now in heaven and to experience His presence now in our hearts. Each recitation of the Rosary is a walk with Mary, a walk whose steps with her bring us ever closer to the true goal of our lives, when we shall see God face to face in heaven and become like Him.

Please do pray the Rosary – for our parish, for our Diocese and our Bishop and Priests, for the Church, for our world. We live in times when there is a lot of noise, so many words with very little of substance being said. These are disturbing and difficult moments, when we need as Catholics to become people of prayer and of intercession for our world. We need also to pray for the sick, the dying and those who have died. We need to pray for saints for our age, for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life, for families and for married couples, for our young and for our old.

We need to pray for the conversion of all people to the Lord, for more labourers in the vineyard to bring the Good News to a world mired in so much bad news, division, and recrimination. We need especially now to pray for the conversion of sinners and peace in the world. We might ask ourselves, "But what can I do? How can I make any difference to all this?" Pray the Rosary – we will make a difference just by praying the Rosary and Our Lady will show us what the Lord wants us to do and how we can do it, just as she did.
